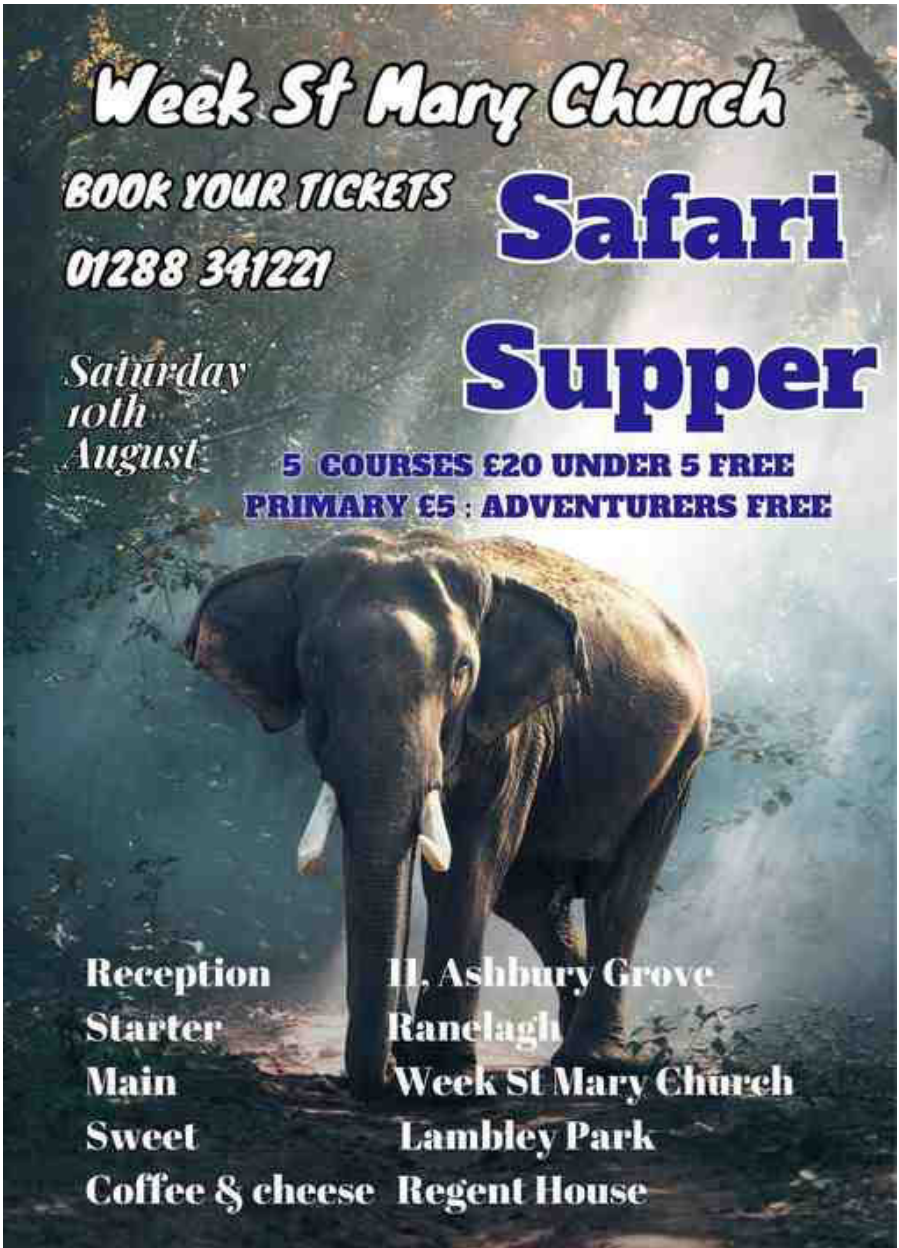

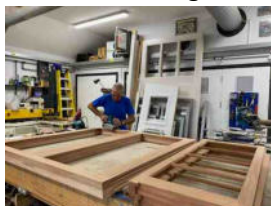

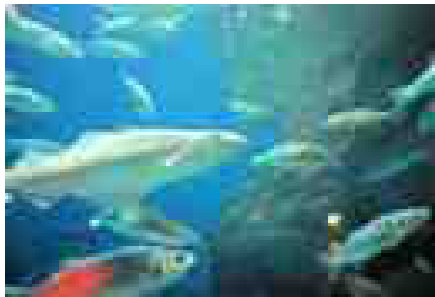

Poor Man’s Piece and the Crowdfunder programme was brought to the council’s attention by one resident. He said it was off to a flying start. Frangipan Flan Recipe

Flan Pastry **Oven temp 200° Fan 180° Gas 6**
4 oz Plain Flour
3 oz Butter or Margarine
1 tsp caster Sugar
1 egg

Rub the fat into the flour until it resembles fine crumbs. Mix in the sugar, add the egg, stirring until the ingredients begin to stick together, then collect the mixture together with one hand and kneed lightly to give a firm smooth dough.

Frangipan filling

2 tbspns raspberry jam **2 oz butter or marg**
2 oz caster sugar **1 egg beaten**
A few drops of almond essence
2 oz ground almonds
½ oz flour, (2 oz icing sugar for topping)

Roll out pastry and line a 7 inch flan ring, taking the pastry up the sides of the flancase. Spread the bottom of the pastry with the jam. Cream together the fat and sugar until pale and fluffy and add the beaten egg and essence a little at a time, beating well after each addition. Fold in the ground almonds and flour with a metal spoon. Put the filling into the jam lined pastry case. Roll out the trimmings of the pasty and cut ¼in (0.6cms) wide strips to form a lattice on top of the filling. Bake flan in the centre of the oven for 10 - 15 mins, then reduce the oven temp to 180° Fan 160° Gas 4 for a further 15 - 20 mins, until the filling is firm; remove from the oven. Mix the flour and icing sugar with a little water to produce a thin icing which can be brushed on top of the flan when cooked.

100g / 4 oz butter

200g / 8 oz granulated sugar

3 standard eggs and 1 standard egg yolk beaten together

Melt butter in a basin standing over a saucepan of gently simmering water (or double saucepan)

Add sugar, beaten eggs and finely grated rind and juice of oranges and lemon.

Ruminations from the Rectory

Bible Passage: Luke 10:25-37 – Parable of the Good Samaritan.

On the 13th of August we remember the life of Florence Nightingale, a nurse and social reformer and a Samaritan whose purpose was to improve the conditions for the wounded during the Crimean War. She dedicated her life to reforming nursing care and selflessly put her heart and soul into helping those who had been wounded.

We all like to think of ourselves as a good neighbour and Samaritan. How could we be anything else as a follower of Christ? But if we are honest with ourselves, can we honestly say we would do anything to help our neighbours? In some cases, do we even know their full names? Or even remember the last time we might have selflessly helped them out of the goodness of our hearts?

Jesus' Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37) draws attention not only to the actions of the characters in this story, but what's in their hearts. We can agree with Jesus' teachings. We can believe in the greatest Commandment – Love the Lord with all your heart, soul, mind and strength - and the Golden Rule – Love your neighbour as yourself. However, Jesus doesn't simply want us to agree with him, ***he wants us to live like him with our hearts, souls and minds.*** The Good Samaritan didn't just love the people he was close to – his own kind - he saw the beaten man, had pity in his heart, and then acted, unlike the priest and the Levite who simply passed by. Likewise, Florence Nightingale didn't just carry out her nursing duties, she chose to put her heart into helping the wounded, believing that she was serving God. This is what service ultimately means. It goes beyond mere duty, for it answers the question 'what would I not do to care for the people I am given to serve and show compassion towards?' Nurses often say so beautifully: 'we

don't just heal with our hands. We heal with our hearts also'. There is a significant lesson to be learnt in this approach in all walks of life.

Service to others involves self-emptying, self-giving, renunciation. We are on holy ground when we serve others with all our heart. And this is what we should celebrate as we remember the life of Florence Nightingale.

Everyone is our neighbour and we are here to serve.

Why are we obliged to use One Time Passcodes more often?

The answer is simple, but not necessarily helpful.

The one-time passcode (OTP) security system has been introduced to protect you and your money and we should all be grateful it has been introduced. It helps stop thieves from accessing your financial accounts.

OK! So why does an OTP appear every time I want to logon to my account?

The answer is equally simple. Your computer is blocking your IP address or a cookie the Bank uses to identify your computer on their server.

Cookies are a pain, but sometimes necessary and you would not be able to access the internet without an IP address.

However, the use of Ad blockers and tracker blockers restrict others from dumping Ads and Cookies on your system, a VPN will block the IP address to all servers on the internet except for the primary server in the chain of servers used by the VPN.

Confused? You may well be! And you would be excused if you are!

We've all become tired and irritated with the plethora of junk ads on our screens, but sadly not all systems are capable of discretionary filtering. For some systems it's all or nothing.

Therefore, as the Banks server doesn't recognise a new, different or no IP address, it needs to check you are who you say you are and you have authority to access your money with a secondary security check.

The lesson here is that to protect yourself from thieves, you have to accept the inconvenience of an effective, sometimes restrictive, system. [amen]

The NHS now wish they had improved security systems instead of the old outdated System. Recent hackers using "go" language to code a ransomware hack, which will cost all British citizens millions of pounds, we are told, 300 million files have been stolen, I believe it is far more. The successful hack has copied all your personal and history details and published some on the Internet. So don't be surprised to receive calls, text and emails from spurious individuals and you can blame it on the NHS IT departments lack of sufficient internet security!

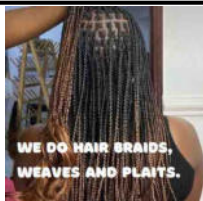

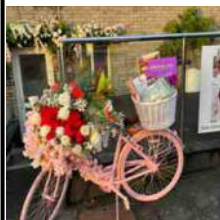
