



#### Week St Mary Bonaventures WI June Meeting

This month we were delighted to welcome Martin Brooks, our local Pilates teacher, to talk to the group.

Martin has been teaching Pilates for more than 14 years and

shared his experience of becoming a teacher following a back injury 25 years ago. Pilates can help with many skeletal conditions and can also supplement other treatments for joint pain in areas such as hips and backs to help avoid surgery.



Pilates was originally designed by Joseph Pilates, a German intern in the UK during the 1<sup>st</sup> World War, and he designed his ideas based on body mechanics which were later published in his book "Return To Life".



The system was designed for use by every-

one but is also used to improve performance for elite sports athletes such as Olympic swimmers and Rugby players.

Martin shared some inspirational quotes from Joseph Pilates such as "The Pilates Method teaches you to be in control of your body not at its mercy".



Martin went on to quiz the group about the name and purpose of various body joints and muscles and worked through a variety of gentle exercises to assist with joint pain and mobility issues. He explained that there may be many reasons for joint pain and how it is essential to concentrate, whenever possible, on good body position and posture to help relieve joint pain. He also used his spine model "George" to explain how



There's no mention of damage or that it does not work. Only a spin on the manufacturers promotional copy!



People should be aware, anything presented via the internet these days can be **fake!!** 

Imagery, Voice, Music all can now be cloned, reconstructed and presented falsely as the real thing. Much work needs to be done, both in development and in governmental control before it becomes the saviour of mankind.

His victory over death. Thomas, however, was not present during this encounter and expressed scepticism when told about Jesus' appearance. He demanded physical proof, stating that he would not believe unless he saw and touched Jesus' wounds. In response to Thomas' doubts, Jesus graciously appeared to him, offering the physical evidence he sought. Upon seeing and touching Jesus, Thomas' doubts were erased, and he proclaimed his belief in Jesus as Lord and God.

This passage emphasizes the importance of faith – believing without seeing. Jesus acknowledges the challenge of believing without tangible evidence, yet He also blesses those who are able to maintain faith without sight.

I am reminded how we often pray when we need help either for ourselves or a loved one, yet we are called to pray often and indeed give thanks, not just when we are in need. We will not always see the signs around us and will have doubts just like St Thomas, but God offers hope and peace in times of trouble.

We are all on different journeys and turn to God in different ways. Our united benefice is full of love and community spirit. Let's keep reminding ourselves that we may not always see what God is doing in our lives and at times may have doubts, but God is love and always present in the ups and downs of life, no matter where we are on our faith journey. All we need are the eyes to see and ears to hear.

#### **Ruminations from the Rectory**

As I write this, I have been in post less than a week. However, during this short time both Dianne and I have been humbled by the kind and loving reception we have received from everyone we have met following my induction and licensing on 9<sup>th</sup> June. It is a truly wonderful community.

Coming from a pastoral ministry calling and wearing a collar in the parishes gives me the opportunity for many 'God conversations', and every now and then I hear the comment "I don't go to church, but it's good to meet you". This is often followed by "But when life gets hard, I do pray for a miracle".

One of the most affirming ministries of my curacy was the time spent in care homes and, in particular, the time spent with dementia patients. I was often struck by those who would not attend my communion services in the community lounges and sat at the other side of the room. They would say they had no faith or indeed doubted their faith, yet when we said the Lord's prayer, they would utter the words of the prayer from the other side of the lounge as if they were recounting a past encounter with faith. These instances affirm to me that even when people doubt, there is still a part of them that places their hope in God.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> of July sees the festival and celebration of St Thomas. Thomas the Apostle, also known as Didymus, was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus, according to the New Testament. He is commonly referred to as "Doubting Thomas" because he initially doubted the resurrection of Jesus Christ. However, upon seeing the healed wounds on Jesus' body after the crucifixion, he confessed his faith with the words, "My lord and my God." The story of Doubting Thomas in John 20:19-31 reminds us of the struggle many people face in their faith journey. It is natural to have doubts and questions, and this passage demonstrates how Jesus compassionately addresses those concerns. When Jesus appeared to His disciples after His resurrection, He offered them peace and showed them His wounds as evidence of

#### **CHOCOLATE BROWNIES**

200g unsalted butter 200g dark chocolate chips 175g brown sugar 3 eggs 1 tsp vanilla extract 75g plain flour 30g cocoa powder

Preheat oven to 180°, Fan 160°, Gas 4.

Grease and line a 20cm/8in square tin with greaseproof paper. Place butter and chocolate chips in a heatproof bowl and microwave for 1 minute approx. until melted (or over a bowl of hot water). Stir until smooth.

Add sugar and vanilla, mix, then add eggs and mix well until smooth.

Add flour, cocoa and salt and stir until smooth. Pour into tin. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes approx.

Rest for 10 minutes before lifting out of the tin. Allow to cool for at least 20 minutes before cutting into 4 squares.

Store in an airtight container for up to 4 days, or freeze for 3 months.

#### **ORANGE CURD**

100g / 4 oz butter 200g / 8 oz granulated sugar 3 standard eggs and 1 standard egg yolk beaten together 2 medium-sized oranges and 1 medium sized lemon

Melt butter in a basin standing over a saucepan of gently simmering water (or double saucepan).

Add sugar, beaten eggs and finely grated rind and juice of oranges and lemon.

Cook gently without boiling until Curd thickens sufficiently to coat the back of a spoon. (This is important because if overheated the mixture may curdle and separate)

Pour into clean, dry and warm jars and cover as for jam.

Store in a very cool place and **Do not keep for longer than two weeks**

#### Frangipan Flan Recipe

Flan PastryOven temp 200° Fan 180° Gas 64 oz Plain Flour3 oz Butter or Margarine1 tsp caster Sugar1 egg

Rub the fat into the flour until it resembles fine crumbs. Mix in the sugar, add the egg, stirring until the ingredients begin to stick together, then collect the mixture together with one hand and kneed lightly to give a firm smooth dough.

#### <u>Frangipan filling</u>

2 tbspns raspberry jam2 oz butter or marg2 oz caster sugar1 egg beatenA few drops of almond essence2 oz ground almonds

#### (1/2 oz flour, 2 oz icing sugar for topping)

Roll out pastry and line a 7 inch flan ring, taking the pastry up the sides of the flancase. Spread the bottom of the pastry with the jam. Cream together the fat and sugar until pale and fluffy and add the beaten egg and essence a little at a time, beating well after each addition. Fold in the ground almonds and flour with a metal spoon. Put the filling into the jam lined pastry case. Roll out the trimmings of the pastry and cut  $\frac{1}{4}$  in (0.6cms) wide strips to form a lattice on top of the filling. Bake flan in the centre of the oven for 10 - 15 mins, then reduce the oven temp to 180° Fan 160° Gas 4 for a further 15 - 20 mins, until the filling is firm; remove from the oven. Mix the flour and icing sugar with a little water to produce a thin icing which can be brushed on top of the flan when cooked.

#### **RUDI AND WILL**

The World Agility Open of 2024 in the Netherlands was one of truly mixed emotions for Will and Rudi as they proudly represented Scotland for the third and final time as a partnership. It had long been decided that this would be Rudi's last event before his retirement from competitive agility after the most incredible career.

Will himself was still recovering from glandular fever but was determined to see Rudi bow out at the very highest level. There were no expectations of a medal, but more a wish to give Rudi the finish to his career that he deserved. For this special spaniel to even be selected to run here when well past his 11th birthday is a testament to his ability.

Will and Rudi took part in several competitions at WAO but the blue riband event was the Pentathlon. The initial aim here is to be high enough up the leader board after two rounds (one jumping and one agility) to make the cut to qualify for rounds three and four. The number of high quality competitors our pair would be facing was clear from the start.

Agility round 1 was in the main arena and a steady, well handled clear round was exactly what was required. This clear round was good enough to see them through to rounds 3 and 4 despite an elimination in Round 2. Part 3 of the pentathlon was another agility round in the main arena. Another great round saw just one error with a missed dog walk and 5 faults. The team needed to be in the top 20 positions in the pentathlon after 4 runs to qualify for the final event the next day. Given the relative speed of Rudi and the position they were in after three runs, this was extremely unlikely. So, part 4 of the pentathlon was going to be Rudi's last ever competitive run.

Will was delighted that the jumping course had been designed and was to be judged by one of Will's favourite judges, Natalie Grace. It was a lovely course for Rudi to finish on and Rudi responded, overcoming some fatigue on what was still a warm day to produce one final clear round. What a super way to finish a stellar career - at the World Championships, with a fantastic judge and going clear.

There were plenty of celebrations and not a few tears from supporters and Scotland team members as Rudi took the final jump. Will and Rudi, in a pentathlon class of nearly 100 of the world's best pairings, finished in a very creditable 35th place.

Thank you to all of those in Team Scotland who were great company and support for everyone.

It's only right to say a few words about Rudi on his retirement. This incredible dog was rehomed aged 17 months and Will was told by his
