

WEEK ST MARY COMMUNITY SHOP & POST OFFICE - THE PAST, THE PRESENT AND THE FUTURE......

There has been a Post Office in Week St Mary since the early 1900's. It was run by Jeff & Monica Roberts for 37 years before becoming community owned on their retirement in 2017 when there was strong support to retain the Shop and Post Office. Funding came from the sale of shares to over 100 residents, supplemented by donations and grants. The aim was to be modestly profitable with any profits either being re-invested in the Shop or to support community projects in the parish of Week St Mary.

A limited company was formed as a co-operative, operating on a 'one member, one vote' principle, irrespective of the number of shares owned. The change to a community run enterprise took place over a weekend in March 2017 without any interruption to service. The supporting business plan had 2 Phases - Phase 1 - to buy the existing business and rent the premises for 4 years; Phase 2 - during the COVID lockdown of 2020, the lease was extended until June 2027.

The value of the facilities to the local community cannot be overstated not only as a retail outlet and Post Office, but also as a social hub for all, especially the elderly and vulnerable, is vitally important. The presence of a village shop also has a proven positive effect on house prices.

The alarming disappearance of High Street banks - the last remaining one in Bude will close in May this year - has led to even greater importance on having Post Office facilities available locally not only to conduct the usual postal services, but to also service an increase in home shopping returns, provide much needed banking services with cash withdrawals and deposits, cheque deposits and the facility to easily pay utility bills. As a sub-Post Office to Bude, the Week St Mary Post Office is staffed by Jackie and Val, together with 4 other Post Office trained vol-

unteers who are all in their sixties or seventies. This identifies an urgent need to recruit some new volunteers willing to train to operate the Post Office to ensure that we can continue to offer these services.

So how can you help as Phase 3 comes onto the horizon?

The day-to-day operation is run by the Manager whilst the business is overseen by a Management Committee which currently only has 4 members all of whom are in their 70's. We therefore desperately need new members as we plan for Phase 3.

Like all businesses, we have faced significant cost increases recently due to rises in the National Living Wage and electricity prices. Coupled with a decline in footfall, this has meant after a modestly profitable period from 2017 to 2023 the shop is now trading at a loss and the Parish Council has started making donations by way of support. We appreciate that most people only use the Shop for daily supplies, incidental items and 'emergency' shopping with very few doing all their weekly shop, however, if we had just 5 new customers a day and others were able to up their spend a bit it would make a HUGE difference to the Shop's profitability as plans are considered for Phase 3.

Nonetheless, our most pressing problem is being able to staff the Shop and Post Office for 44 hours across 7 days. We have a fantastic loyal core of dedicated volunteers but, as some get older, there is an URGENT need to add to our numbers. Without new volunteers particularly some willing to be trained to operate the Post Office, this simply may not be possible.

So, if you could spare some time just once a week, or on an ad hoc basis, it would make a HUGE difference. You may choose to be customer facing in the Shop or prefer to help out behind the scenes with e.g. stocking, accounts or marketing. If you are new to the village, it is a great way to meet people and get involved. If you are interested in joining the Management Committee or becoming a shop volunteer, we would be delighted to hear from you. WEEK ST MARY BONAVENTURES W.I.

If you see a marine animal on the beach STOP! That was the key message being passed to members by our 2 speakers from the BDMLR: Michelle Clement and Michaela Gilbert-Smith. They are both volunteer Marine Mammal Medics, currently working along the North Cornwall/Devon coastline. Extremely helpful advice was given on the do's and don'ts when finding these animals. SEE BELOW

British Divers Marine Life Rescue (BDMLR) was formed in 1988 when a few like-minded divers got together in response to a mass mortality of common seals in the Wash area of East Anglia. The aim was to do what they could for the rescue effort in response to a virus epidemic resulting in thousands of deaths. Since then, they have been involved in the rescue of all marine wild-life after every major marine disaster.

In 1997 the charity created and ran the first Marine Mammal Medic course held in the UK and began forming its national volunteer response network. The network of Marine Mammal Medics is trained in first aid, health assessment and rescue techniques for sick and injured seals, porpoises, dolphins, whales and turtles. The teams are equipped with specialist rescue equipment such as whale flotation pontoons, seal bags, dolphin stretchers and more to aid the casualties, and are in regular contact with veterinary consultants for advice and care. Calls to the BDMLR surpassed 3,000 for the first time in a single year in 2021.

The BDMLR works alongside other similar charities worldwide and in 2013 set up the UK's first and only specialised Large Whale Disentanglement Team to rescue entangled whales at sea, with training provided by the Center for Coastal Studies and International Fund for Animal Welfare in the USA.

Seal rescue has remained a major component of the charity's work, with medics rescuing animals in all seasons around the UK. In 2017, with funding from the Seal Protection Action Group, the BDMLR designed and created the UK's first Mobile Seal Rescue Unit – a horse box converted and customised into a fully equipped temporary holding and treatment facility. Later, in 2021, it opened its first custom-built seal hospital in Cornwall to help cope with the high influxes of seal casualties affected by storms linked with climate change.

<u>Seals</u>: Do NOT approach, it is normal for a seal not to be in the water. Do NOT make a noise, seals are easily disturbed Do NOT let dogs near even on a lead, they will alarm the seal.

Ah, but you have video cameras and security system with online links. A pair of pliers can stop that very quickly, especially as the black fibre optic cable can be accessed from outside the house and if your router is not fully secure it too can be switched off from a distance of 30 metres. NB: Routers can also be accessed through a printers direct WiFi connection if not secure. — Happy Holiday! Oh! Did I tell you about booking.com — No? well, maybe next time!

Thanks to the award of some new funding, we can now visit the village on a regular basis, to hold individual confidential interviews with those who may be experiencing difficulties. Our experienced and fully trained team of volunteers provide this free service, and we aim to reach those residents who may find it awkward to visit us, through poor public transport. Many of our clients have problems dealing with complicated 'forms' related to benefits, or in contacting utility providers. Some, particularly our older clients have poor or no IT (computer) skills that are now essential when in touch with government departments .Please watch your local notice boards for details of when we shall be around, or you can contact us direct to arrange an appointment at any time on 01566 777407, by email – office@launcestonmoney.co.uk or on our mobile 07762 092830.

We know there are many local people who would like some help. CMAL has already helped over 800 North Cornwall residents, so we shall be pleased to hear from you, and help others.

AI and the Ministry of Misinformation

I listened to the Prime Minister the other day, he was saying the UK should be an epicentre for AI, which I agree with. Then he said the most ridiculous thing that AI will help fix the pot

holes in the road and this type of misinformed talk only serves to confuse computer users into thinking AI can work wonders, in truth AI is being used by scammers and thieves more effectively than most businesses at this time. That will change but it's a few years away just yet. So, if you



hear AI can make Pigs Fly or that Brad Pitt is in hospital and cannot afford the hospital fees, or a Nigerian Prince or Princess is madly in love with you, but can't afford the air fare to visit you reflect on AI fixing potholes in the road,

you may just see that flock of pigs overhead.

I was called to fix a computer which seemingly had been taken over by McAfee anti-virus software and no matter what the user did to try and avoid it all that was presented on screen were warnings the system had 5 infections and needed clearing out. "Press here to continue". In fact, the system had 8 infections and all from a Russian scammer, how did I know that? The scammer was stupid enough to display his email address on the screen and not the McAfee website address.

Why had this happened? the user failed to notice the installed antivirus software had failed to start and the system was exposed to online attackers.

The moral here is when switching a computer on, check to make sure you are fully protected before accessing the internet, especially Social Media Sites.

What's that you say? You have nothing of value to steal because you don't bank online or shop for groceries, you just communicate with a few emails and watch a few videos on TIKTOK.

Did you know that your email address and system IP address can be sold for about £10 and your full identity is worth between £50 and £500, depending on your perceived wealth. Big House, Big Car, Golf club membership, Foreign Holidays are all wealth indicators and an empty house can be flagged up if booking a car hire for 2 weeks in Spain, or anywhere else for that matter!

DO watch for signs of mum, she may be away feeding and will return.

DO call BDMLR with location if it is ill, injured or separated from mum. DO stay if you can to help Medics locate the seal.

<u>**Dolphin/Whale**</u>: Do NOT put it it back in the sea-it needs to be checked by Medics.

Do NOT pull, stand over or next to its tail, the tail will hurt if it hits you. Do NOT attempt to interact, it may be distressed.

DO call BDMLR immediately, every second is critical for Medics.

DO keep it upright-if you can turn it on its belly, careful with fins.

DO keep it wet with water (not in blowhole) or seaweed

DO stay quiet and keep crowds and people away.

<u>Turtle</u>: Do NOT put back in the sea, it could kill it due to hypothermia. Do NOT warm it up immediately, it needs specialist care. DO call BDMLR immediately, they can organise specialist care and transport.

DO wrap it up (e.g. dry towel) to maintain its temperature. EMERGENCY HELPLINE: 01825 765546 – why not put it on your mobile?
