





<u>Week St Mary Bonaventures</u> <u>Women's Institute - September Meeting</u>

This month we were delighted to welcome David Thorn who shared with us some fascinating photographs from the archive of Bude photography curated by the business run by his ancestors.

David's ancestor Harry Thorn, born in 1838, was a pioneer in

photography and brought his business to



Bude in the early 1860's and developed the studio with the help of his brother Samuel and sister Sarah, both of whom appear in many of his images.



David shared many fascinating pictures with the group which

charted the changes in Bude over the late 19th and early 20th century and documented many historical events in the town.

In his images of the numerous shipwrecks in Bude, local landmarks such as the barrel rock and original storm tower could be seen and there were many locals visible in the pictures. It was striking how well dressed the spectators were in what appeared to be their "Sunday best" with very smart hats and coats. The very early images of the wreck of the Bencoolen in 1862 showed the large amounts of smashed wood from the hull which were salvaged and used as timber for houses and workshops helping Bude to prosper in the latter half of the 19th century.

Another famous image shared by David was of the river and the Strand in Bude around 1871-1876. This can be accurately dated as the 5 gabled houses, now Greville Terrace, in the picture are listed as "under construction" in the 1871 census. The Globe Hotel in the centre right is just visible.

David also shared images of the new lifeboat house and lifeboat,



the railway coming to Bude, the opening of the new sea pool and the Picture House where an advertising poster for a Charlie Chaplin movie was visible.

This was a fascinating historical talk and brought to life the history of Bude over the last 150 years and we were very grateful to David for his knowledgeable and enthusiastic sharing of the family story.

For anyone interested in learning more, a detailed historical account of the family, the photography business and many fascinating images can be found in his book "Thorns of Bude". A treasure for anyone interested in local history in pictures.

Computer gaming benefits and dangers.

Many educators are seeing a rise in the number of students with behavioural issues and parents at their wit's end in not knowing how to deal with them.

Many parents with children addicted to computer gaming, and addiction it is! Don't know what help is available. Some believe there's a stigma surrounding the admission a child is unruly or uncontrollable and will not seek help or advice, but the issue is greater and more widespread than you may think!

I have one such customer who's 11-year-old child refuses to go to school, will not participate in family activities, will not eat at meal times and expresses a knowledge of the law which would amaze any barrister. Saying, you can't make me do that and if you smack me, I will report you to the police etc, etc, etc.

Advocates of computer gaming will tell you there's strong evidence that video games can improve the learning experience and enable students to develop their interpersonal skills with positive effects in an educational context:

- · Provides experiential learning
- Engages students in STEM subjects
- · Improves learning capabilities
- Enhances problem solving
- · Encourages inclusivity

But conversely, despite the many benefits, gaming does have downsides. Here are some of the negative effects of gaming that some students can experience when playing video games:

- · Conflict in the Home environment
- Poor physical health and hygiene
- · Mental health problems
- · Neglecting schoolwork and poor exam results
- Lack of interest in other activities
- Cyberbullying and anti-social behaviour

In these cases, the recommendations are to "Monitor Gaming Habits" and engage in open conversations about their experiences.

Week St. Mary Parish Council held on Thursday, August 1st 2024

1 **Public question time** (15 minutes allowed for this – on matters on the agenda only)

None.

2 To receive County Councillor Nicky Chopak's report on matters arising

Cllr Chopak said the new Lib Dem North Cornwall MP Ben Maguire is hoping to visit every parish in the next few months, either attending an event or a parish council meeting. She said that he is able to give her a heads up about issues, and she has already noticed a positive difference in how they work together.

Cornwall Council – the waste and recycling service is rolling out with some residents in the area already having received bins or bags. She said there have been some queries from people who have received the wrong thing, but she advised people to hang tight while it is being rolled out. Car parks – Cornwall Council Cabinet decided to potentially transfer some car parks to a third party. This has not gone through full council yet and may not happen until spring. They also wanted to transfer Newquay Airport. This has been referred to a judicial review.

Locally, a meeting was held regarding Stratton Minor Injuries Unit and its overnight service. It appears that not enough people are using Stratton. The League of Friends of Stratton Hospital are working to get some more facilities installed there. Work in progress.

The next Community Area Partnership meeting will be held on Monday and will focus on young people, and trying to understand what there is for young people in the area. Cllr Chopak also noted that the Canworthy Water solar plans were refused by a significant margin.

1 Path project

Following correspondence from Cornwall Council, including confirmation of deadlines, the council decided to not proceed with the path project. The clerk will send a letter on behalf of the council expressing its frustration at the process.

2 Gov.uk emails

The clerk explained the recommendation for parish councils to adopt a gov.uk email system. Councillors were not keen on spending money on the domain, and instead the clerk will look into other alternatives for council emails.

3 Equipment

The council received a number of quotes in order to purchase its own mower. Cllr Peters said there was £1,000 in the budget for the path project which could now be used for the purchase of a mower. Councillors accepted a quote from Bridgmans for £2,889 including VAT.

It was also agreed to contact the football club to let them know as of October 1, the parish council would take over the cutting of the top field.

4 Lambley Corner

The posts are now in place. John Grigg has donated the rope and the council extended thanks to him. Cllr Hamlyn will trim the hedge.

5 Speed indicator sign

The council received correspondence asking for a speed indicator sign to be installed. The clerk contacted Cornwall highways who said they could request another visit for speed monitoring. The council agreed to request this. Cllr Chopak advised that there would be no change to the speed limit until the end of 2025 (with the possible change to 20mph). Next autumn parishes will be asked if they are in favour of a 20mph speed limit.

6 South West Water

Cllr Slade explained that the water pressure at the top of the village is a nightmare, with either no pressure or the pressure suddenly drops. She felt the council should write to South West Water with its concerns over safety (i.e showering an elderly person or a young child).

7 Barn conversion

The council received correspondence about a conversion with materials encroaching onto the path. Cllr Chopak said she has spoken with the neighbours and has advised them to take legal advice. It is not a matter for the parish council.

Ruminations from the Rectory

Did you know that October 4 is World Smile Day?

Celebrated on the first Friday of October, World Smile Day encourages acts of kindness and the spreading of happiness through smiles. Across the world, people are encouraged to perform random acts of kindness, whether it be smiling at strangers, volunteering, or helping those in need. The day promotes the idea that a simple smile can brighten someone's day and create a ripple effect of positivity. In the book *The Face of Emotion*, by Carroll E. Izard, the writer describes smiling as a positive expression understood by everyone, regardless of culture, race or religion. Crosscultural studies have found that even among tribes who have little contact with Western civilization, their smiles are universal. Smiles are an expression of love and friendship that benefits both the smiler and the receiver of that smile. Interestingly, a 30-year study by psychologists Lee-Anne Harker and Dacher Keltner at the University of California at Berkley looked at 141 high school senior-class photos from the 1960 year book of Mills College. The trained psychologists examined the photos, separating those with real genuine smiles and those who didn't really want to smile. There was a fifty-fifty split. All of the smilers were contacted at various ages of their lives and asked various questions about their happiness and satisfaction with life. Was there a link between genuine smilers and happiness? The results were fascinating...

The study found that women with natural smiles were more likely to be happier and also more likely to experience a greater sense of personal well-being. These results were found to be consistent in a 30-year follow up. The conclusion was that those who smile naturally may be happier in life. Furthermore, those who smile throughout life also pass on their happiness to others.

As Mother Teresa said, "I will never understand all the good

that a simple smile can accomplish."

And what does the Bible say about smiling? In the Book of Proverbs Solomon states: 'Light in a messenger's eyes brings joy to the heart, and good news gives health to the bones'. (15:30 NIV). A smile brings comfort and good health to others.

This month, as we head to darker days and mornings, let's not forget the power of a smile on ourselves and others; the kindness it can show and the lives it can change. You may be the only one someone sees each day, or you may not know what someone is going through in life, so let your coming and going be with a smile.


