Councillors approved the minutes of the Ordinary meeting held on Wednesday, July 3, 2024.

8a **To discuss and make a consultee comment on application:** PA24/05261 – Conversion of a stone barn, now redundant, into a single dwelling house with associated private amenity space and parking. Marhayes, Marhamchurch. Councillors proposed no objection to the plans.

Cllrs Slade and Johns left the room and Cllr Richardson took the chair. Councillors proposed no objection to the plans.

9 **Portfolio Reports:** Playground

Cllr Johns said the bench inside the emergency gate is rotting. Cllr Hamlyn said it had been donated by a local family. Cllr Bolt will speak to the family about a possible replacement. Cllr Johns has painted the shed in the playing field – thanks were extended to her and to Cllr Hamlyn for their work. Cllr Hamlyn said someone had reversed into the lower gate and bowed it.

Highways, Footpaths & Greens

Cllr Hamlyn had received a message about trees felled in the gateway of a property opposite Broad Close. He has reported a number of pot holes – some have already been repaired and others marked for repair. Cllr Johns had received a message about speeding in the village and an enquiry over purchasing a flashing speed indicator sign. Cllr Bolt said the local group were looking at what speeds are in the village and then they can go to Cornwall Council with the data. The clerk to speak

to Cornwall Council and Cllr Chopak again regarding the speeding and also the 20mph scheme.

11 Community Infrastructure Levy and Community Benefit Fund applications

Week St Mary Chapel graveyard; Friends of Week St Mary Church, Churchyard and Graveyard. It was proposed to grant £400 (made up of a payment of £200 for 2023 and £200 for 2024) out of the Community Benefit Fund to both. The clerk to contact both applicants to ask them to get back in touch in September with their requirements for 2025 before the budgeting process begins.

12 Agenda items

Lambley Corner

Oliver Jones (CORMAC) has confirmed permission for the posts and wild flowers at Lambley Corner. The clerk will submit the licence. Cllr Hamlyn will begin the work.

Ashbury Grove

Councillors received the latest correspondence about Ashbury Grove. It was confirmed that someone had attended occasionally to cut the grass, and the shrubs have been kept tidy by residents.

New area playing field

Cllr Slade noted that the area is currently stable, with the grass taking root. When quotes were sought for the drainage work, they said the angle of the bank was too steep, but it has found its own level. Cllr Hamlyn suggested getting some top soil to fill the voids and stop the water building up in the voids. There is an abundance of willow at the bottom of the field, and when it starts to die back, this could be used to stabilise the bank. It was also noted that the bottom area can now be opened up to walkers. The signs asking people to avoid the area will be taken



down.

Cllr Johns suggested the installation of a bin down there, as there is a picnic bench already there. Cllr Hamlyn will source one and install.

Pensions Discretions Policy

Councillors voted in favour of adopting the circulated Pensions Discretions Policy.

Financial Regulations and Standing Orders

Councillors reviewed the updated Financial Regulations and proposed to adopt them.

Councillors reviewed and re-adopted the Standing Orders.

Path project

The council received correspondence from Cornwall Council to ask if it was still interested in proceeding on the funding path, as some projects ahead of the project were moving up the reserve list. Cllr Peters felt the project was dead in the water and had only moved from sixth the fifth reserve. Cllr Richardson said the council could still say it was interested, then if it unfolds, could look at it to re-assess. Councillors agreed to progress.

Frangipan Flan - Recipe provided

<u>Frangipan Flan Recipe</u> <u>Flan Pastry</u> Oven temp 200° Fan 180° Gas 6 4 oz Plain Flour 3 oz Butter or Margarine 1 tsp caster Sugar 1 egg

Rub the fat into the flour until it resembles fine crumbs. Mix in the sugar, add the egg, stirring until the ingredients begin to stick together, then collect the mixture together with one hand and kneed lightly to give a firm smooth dough.

Frangipan filling

2 tbspns raspberry jam2 oz butter or marg2 oz caster sugar1 egg beatenA few drops of almond essence2 oz ground almonds½ oz flour, (2 oz icing sugar for topping)

Roll out pastry and line a 7 inch flan ring, taking the pastry up the sides of the flancase. Spread the bottom of the pastry with the jam. Cream together the fat and sugar until pale and fluffy and add the beaten egg and essence a little at a time, beating well after each addition. Fold in the ground almonds and flour with a metal spoon. Put the filling into the jam lined pastry case. Roll out the trimmings of the pastry and cut $\frac{1}{4}$ in (0.6cms) wide strips to form a lattice on top of the filling. Bake flan in the centre of the oven for 10 - 15 mins, then reduce the oven temp to 180° Fan 160° Gas 4 for a further 15 - 20 mins, until the filling is firm; remove from the oven. Mix the icing sugar with a little water to produce a thin icing which can be brushed on top of the flan when cooked.

CORNISH PASTY – Any Recipe maximum length 18cm (6inches)

PRESERVES BEETROOT CHUTNEY - Any Recipe

ORANGE CURD

100g / 4 oz butter 200g / 8 oz granulated sugar 3 standard eggs and 1 standard egg yolk beaten together 2 medium-sized oranges and 1 medium sized lemon

Melt butter in a basin standing over a saucepan of gently simmering water (or double saucepan)

Add sugar, beaten eggs and finely grated rind and juice of oranges and lemon.

Cook gently without boiling until Curd thickens sufficiently to coat the back of a spoon. (This is important because if overheated the mixture may curdle and separate)

Pour into clean, dry and warm jars and cover as for jam.

Store in a very cool place and **Do not keep for longer than two weeks**

200g unsalted butter 200g dark chocolate chips 175g brown sugar 3 eggs 1 tsp vanilla extract 75g plain flour 30g cocoa powder

Preheat oven to 180°, Fan 160°, Gas 4

Grease and line a 20cm/8in square tin with greaseproof paper.

Place butter and chocolate chips in a heatproof bowl and microwave for 1 minute approx. until melted (or over a bowl of hot water). Stir until smooth.

Add sugar and vanilla, mix, then add eggs and mix well until smooth.

Add flour, cocoa and salt and stir until smooth. Pour into tin. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes approx.

Rest for 10 minutes before lifting out of the tin. Allow to cool for at least 20 minutes before cutting into 4 squares.

Store in an airtight container for up to 4 days, or freeze for 3 months.

At Last OFCOM is doing its job!

A new directive by Ofcom, published: 29th July has given phone companies 6 months to come up with plans to stop spoof calls.

These must include

- Block more calls from abroad which imitate UK landline numbers.
- More effort must be employed to reduce suspicious calls and texts.
- Prove the disruption of spoofing from abroad and mobile messaging scams.

People will be better protected against scammers who call from abroad and imitate UK landline numbers, under strengthened industry guidance.

This guidance will come into effect from 29th January 2025.

Hopefully this will now help reduce the number of scam calls hitting every home.

I've spoken at length on my reservations regarding AI and I know it will eventually benefit mankind in many ways. However, the shortterm use is misguided and wrong! This is borne out by Microsoft who have suspended the publication of their AI voice simulator as being too dangerous for general use. This software which can not only clone an exact voice pattern and convert a text document into real time audio, although text to speech has been used for many years using simulated voices, the accuracy is now such that any voice when cloned and published with totally fake dialogue



and imagery will have devastating consequence! However other software companies continue to promote similar systems and this will only lead to many future scams.

The incarceration of Stop Oil protestors made me think of a recent study by Oxford University on the annual Green House Gas emissions of a computer. The study shows the carbon footprints of some typical working Personal Computers:

- Desktop + screen emits 621kg CO2e
- Laptop + screen emits 691kg CO₂e (up 11%)
- Desktop + 2 screens emit 903kg CO₂e (up 45%)
- Laptop + screen at office + screen at home emits 928kg CO₂e (up 49%)
- Desktop + screen + laptop emits 1,030kg CO2e (up 66%)

Over 95% of all computer components are made in China and most electronic systems are made with over 90% plastic components, the burning of fossil fuels is not the only contributor to global warming and the more we use computers and mobile phones the more CO₂ is pushed into the atmosphere, then there is the mining of cobalt to make the batteries using child labour in Africa and the highly toxic burning of components in India to retrieve small amounts of gold from old motherboards, I could go on!
