Week St Mary Parish Council

Minutes - November 7, 2024

1. Public question time (15 minutes allowed for this – on matters on the agenda only) One member of the public (MOP) spoke about the application PA24/07181. She said 12 objectors have submitted their disapproval at the plans. She questioned why the applicant wants to use their drive for access. Another MOP said there was already a problem in the area with water. He questioned how vehicles, especially bin collections and delivery drivers can access the area. He feared a large number of cars would be generated from the houses, if built. He said it is a blind turning, and raised concerns about what will happen to the rest of the field if planning permission is granted. He said there is also evidence of Sparrow Hawks, Buzzards and Gold Crests.

A MOP asked about the funding application from the football club towards to goalposts. He said the club is keen to get the new goal posts put in on the top pitch. He also addressed the council about the need to extend the lease on the pitch – this is needed if they are to apply for FA and Football Foundation grants.

 Cllr Chopak said there had been a vote of no confidence in the leader of Cornwall

 Council. Although this failed, it is hoped that it will be a wake-up call. Cllr Chopak
 said she sits on the Health and Adult Social Care Committee, and there have been
 lengthy discussions about putting fluoride in water. Cornwall Council will be writing to
 the Secretary of State, and there will be a public consultation to ask people if they
 would like fluoride in their water. Cllr Chopak has recently given £500 from her
 Community Chest to pay for toothbrushes, which some children do not have. Cllr
 Chopak said the new waste and recycling scheme has begun and there have been
 some issues. There will be a meeting on November 18 to discuss how Stratton Minor
 Injuries Unit will operate in the future.

PA24/07181 – Outline Planning Permission with all matters reserved for proposed residential development (up to five dwellings). Land east of The Coach House, Week Green, Week St Mary.

Councillors raised objection to the plans on the grounds of – narrow entrance; safety concerns around the entrance; not consistent with the intention around an AGLV designation; market housing and not starter homes; environmental impact (habitats); overdevelopment.

PA24/07340 – Conversion of integral garage and extension to rear, and other alterations. Church View, Week St Mary.

Councillors raised no objection to the plans.

Proposed: I Richardson Seconded: R Bolt Votes: Unanimous 24/129

PA24/08039 – Works to trees in a Conservation area (TCA): to reduce the crown of T1 Oak tree by approximately 1m to maintain distance from property number 17. 14 Ashbury Grove, Week St Mary.

Councillors raised no objection to the plans.

Proposed: S Gubbin Seconded: T Hamlyn Votes: Seven in favour, one abstention 24/130

PA24/07696 – Works to trees in a Conservation Area (TCA) T1 Ash tree – remove to ground level (ash dieback) and T2 Oak tree – reduce approximately 1 metre. 14 Ashbury Grove, Week St Mary.

Councillors raised no objection to the plans.

Proposed: I Richardson Seconded: R Shipton Votes: Seven in favour, one abstention 24/131

PA24/05722 – Change of use of land to form part of garden and construction of summerhouse. Lambley Park, Week St Mary.

Councillors raised no objection to the plans. They did stipulate that it cannot be used as separate residential accommodation, and can only be used with the leisure and recreational use in connection with the main property.

Highways, Footpaths & Greens

Cllr Slade noted that Brenda Crocker White had donated some more seeds. Many thanks to her. Cllr Hamlyn has also trimmed the Lambley Corner area. Cllr Hamlyn said he has reported a number of pot holes, although county council funds are stretched. He has removed the centre posts for the football club and has re-written the lettering on the emergency sign inside the gate. Cllr Slade said some people are querying the spraying in the village. The clerk will go back to Jamie to check the areas sprayed.

12. Agenda items

1. Streetlighting initiative

Councillors noted information from Cornwall Council about the initiative to switch off the street lights. Cllr Slade said people have commented that it's dark. 24/140

2. South West Water

The clerk read a letter the council had received from South West Water in response to the follow-up complaint. Cllr Chopak said she had a meeting with SWW on October 10 at which they promise actions. She has also spoken with Ben Maguire, North Cornwall MP about it, and he will also follow up. A representative is to be invited to a parish council meeting.

3. Playing field

Cllr Slade said the parish council has taken over the cutting of the top of the playing field in line with the dividing fence, and the changing rooms. Also, the slip-way on the right-hand side and the bottom new area. The football club will continue to cut the

bottom field, where their sheds are and where they park their cars. She urged that there be no grass tipping down there or in the ditches.

Cllr Slade said there had been damage done to part of the fence that goes between the two fields. Cllr Hamlyn repaired the damage at short notice, but this had to be carried out quickly.

Paddy Fay, chairman of the football club said there had been a break in to the changing rooms, sometime from Saturday until late on Wednesday evening. There was possibly a window left open.

Cllr Slade urged councillors and members of the public to keep their eyes open for any damage sustained in the parish. The more money the parish council has got to spend on repairs, the less money that will be available to the parish.

Cllr Hamlyn commented on the initial reports from the playing field inspection. This picked up a couple of points with the ramp. The cost of materials to make this good would be £339.60 inc VAT plus a 10% discount.

Councillors agreed for Cllr Hamlyn to carry on with this work.

Proposed: S Peters Seconded: I Richardson Votes: Unanimous 24/142 The clerk will forward on the email to the football club, as it contains a piece about a rotten fence post.

Mr Fay was asked for clarification on the posts. Cllr Slade reiterated that the goals must not be socketed, as the sockets cannot be left in the ground. The goals will be placed on the December agenda so that the parish council and football club are clear with what is happening.

4. Parsonage Green

Cllr Slade said that parking is a problem in the area, and recently it has been very busy. It has been an ongoing problem for years and is from the pub car park upwards, with vehicles solidly parked. She said there is a risk of the fire brigade or ambulance not being able to get through. The clerk and Cllr Chopak will go back to Oliver Jones at Highways to say that the current situation is not working and what can be done.
